

- Her work satirised men's magazines
- She was bored by flat 2D images that were everywhere in the 1950's
- She added cardboard and wood to build her work up in a sculptural manner, challenging a passive gaze
- She broke into the artwork via Pace Gallery's 1964 show, "International Girlie Show".
- She exhibited some her most renown works, such as *Woman with Radish,* alongside Warhol and Lichtenstein
- She never had children as she knew she wouldn't be able focus on her art
- When few women were noticed by the art world, Strider broke into it fearlessly and with a sense of humour
